- New carpet 10'x10' or larger

- Slate/Marble and ceramic tile • Hardwood/Parguet flooring, 25 sq. ft. or more
- Furniture Residential, structurally sound, not upholstered
- Bedroom furniture (*no mattresses*) • Book shelves, case goods
- Tables and chairs

Hardware

 Complete sets of door hardware • Hinges, nails, screws, hangers, etc.

Lighting Complete and in working order. No fluorescent or can lights

• Fixtures and ceiling fans

Lumber and Sheetrock No scrap lumber, nails, concrete on wood

- Dimensional, 6' or longer
 Trim and molding, 6' or longer
- Sheetrock and plywood, 4' x 8' or larger

Paint and Wall Coverings

• Latex only, full, unopened and non-rusted

Plumbing No cast iron

- Faucets, complete sets onlyToilets, *residential only*
 - Sinks kitchen/bath, pedestal, without rust/cracks • Miscellaneous plumbing hardware, fittings, pipes

• Wallpaper, borders, tools, glue

- Shower enclosures, *no cracks or stai*ns
- Bathtubs fiberglass, claw-foot, steel, space permitting

Double Paned Windows No sashes, single pane or storm windows.

Double Hung, picture, or bay - complete, without rot, cracks, or foggy glass.

Miscellaneous All in working order

- Garden tools Hand/power tools
- Water heaters, 5 years old or newer
- Shutters
- HVAC units, 5 years old or newer

Items NOT accepted by Habitat for Humanity:
